## NEW TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

The University of Nebraska has a new training program for agricultural educators. It replaces the Department of Vocational Education established in 1922 for the purpose of training vocational agriculture and vocational homemaking teachers.

The new department, known as Agricultural Education, has as its purpose the training of men to be:

- 1. teachers of vocational agriculture
- 2. teachers of general agriculture and shop
- 3. county agents and other agricultural extension workers
- 4. agricultural missionaries and teachers in foreign services
- 5. agricultural education directors in industry, commerce and special programs.

Advantages of the new program include additional course offerings, greater emphasis on research, and an improved in-service program, including a definite program of off-campus classes and workshops.
